
Optimal Breastfeeding

 Initiation of first feeding as exclusive breastfeeding within one hour

• Exclusive breastfeeding up to 6 months

 Continued breastfeeding for 2 years along with complementary feeding

Poor Breastfeeding Indices

- Lack of awareness about infant feeding
- Socio-cultural practices and taboos
- Inadequately trained health worker
- Indifferent health care system
- Lack of support at all levels--health facility, work place, community
- Commercial exploitation by IMS manufacturers



Why

- Usually we take Twodimension Approach while dealing with Breastfeeding issues.
 - *Time* i.e. From Pre pregnancy to weaning.
 - Place i.e.
 Home, Community, Healt h care system.
- THIRD dimension is "COMMUNICATION"
 - The theme deals with communication at various levels and between various sectors.



What is Communication?

- Bloomsbury Dictionary defines it as:
- 1. "To give to another as a partaker; transmit, impart"
- 2. "To make known"
- 3. "To have interchange of thoughts"

Talk to Me! Breastfeeding – 3D experience

- Talk about Breastfeeding
 - As a decision maker
 - As a Caregiver
 - As a health administrator
 - As a family member
 - As a member of the society

Communication skills

- **Listening and learning skills**
- Confidence building skills
- Checking understanding skills

Communication skills have to be acquired

- Closed questions
- a.Did you breastfeed?

b.Can you donate blood?

c.Can you look after this baby at home?

- Open questions
- a. How are you feeding?
- b.How will you arrange blood?
- c.What will you do for this baby at home?

Confidence building

- Accept what a person thinks or feels
- Praise what a person doing right
- Offer some practical help
- Provide relevant information
- Use simple language
- Give suggestions not 'commands'

Communication skills have to be learnt

- Commands
- a.Give only expressed milk to the baby
- b.Do not allow relatives to kiss the baby
- c.Do not bathe baby daily

- Suggestions
- a.Many mothers feed expressed milk. Is it possible for you to do that?
- b.Can you ask relatives not to kiss the baby?
- c.How about not to give bath daily?
